

- Leeds Nightline is looking for volunteers to help run the service. Nightline is an anonymous, non-advisory and non-judgemental telephone listening service that don't tell callers what to do, they simply listen to you and provide you with the information you need. Too Good To Go scheme:

Great Food at Leeds are passionate about making a difference to the environment and to our community, and they hope to encourage students across the University of Leeds to do so too! Last year they introduced the *Too Good To Go* initiative at The Refectory and in the Business School Café to reduce food waste by offering surplus food at a cheaper cost, the concept has saved over 2 million meals so far – that's the equivalent to avoiding 3 million tonnes of carbon dioxide emissions, the same as the energy required to power 324 homes for an entire year!
