Please note this is not a conventional workshop — we do not provide training on how to improve your writing. You will also need to bring your own laptop or writing materials. #### **Research Nights**

While our Research Nights programme of talks takes a break for the summer it's a good chance to tell you a little more about it. Over our 7 previous events, we have heard talks from 21 researchers, covering subjects as diverse as Islamic Sufis, the science of chocolate, social media, planet formation and spinal reflexes! Each Research Nights event features 3 speakers delivering short presentations about their research. We provide a training session for all participants, as our audience is more general than you would find at a subject-specific conference.
