Mumps suspected to be circulating among students - advice and information on what to do

Mumps has been confirmed in a student at the University and further cases are suspected in Leeds students. Mumps is a contagious viral infection, with potential for serious side-effects. The best protection is to make sure that you have had two doses of the MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella) vaccination.

If you're unsure about whether you've had both doses of the vaccination or you've not had it at all, please contact your GP to check and get vaccinated. We also have <u>more information on how to</u> <u>recognise mumps and protect yourself.</u>
