- Individual Writing Consultations, 1-3pm, Tuesdays. Available to book through the <u>training catalogue</u>: 30 minute consultations to develop your doctoral writing (NB not proofreading). Focus is on helping you to help yourself resolve a specific writing issue.
- Peer Review Workshop for PGRs in the Faculty of Arts, Humanities and Cultures. The workshop will consist
 of two activities: a panel session with experienced reviewers/editors/publishers from different
