# Green Christmas CHECKLIST 

## An extra 30\% more waste is produced over the Christmas period ${ }^{1}$. Here are some easy ways that you can be more green this Christmas.

## ECO-FRIENDLY GIFT IDEAS

Tickets to the theatre, the cinema, to concerts, the football, galleries, \& museums.
$\square$ Hand-made gifts, items from charity shops or gifts that you received but don't use.
$\square$ Consumables like homemade cookies, bottles of wine, local jam or honey.
$\square$ Plants such as potted plants, seedlings, potted herbs for cooking enthusiasts or nonimported fresh flowers.
$\square$ Memberships to organisations like the National Trust, or subscriptions to their favourite magazine.
$\square$ If you have a specific idea in mind, aim for it to be single-use plastic-free!

## WRAPPING

$\square$ Switch wrapping paper out for fabric like the Japanese tradition of furoshiki using repurposed saris, scarves \& cloth swatches.
$\square$ Use newspaper (preferably a big, fancylooking broadsheet) which can be recycled afterwards.
$\square$ Make your own using brown paper \& potato stamps!
$\square$ Reuse bags, bows \& ribbons from gifts you received last year.
$\square$ Turn last year's cards into this year's tags.

## REDUCING WASTE

Look for festive jumpers \& party outfits in charity shops or see if you can borrow items from friends/family.$\square$ If buying ornaments for your flat, consider non-plastic ones - check out Etsy, or make your own from cinnamon sticks, dried citrus rings, or pinecones.
$\square$ Recycle as much packaging waste from deliveries as possible - it's possible to recycle Styrofoam!
$\square$ Take reusable bags with you when doing your Christmas shopping.
$\square$ Avoid disposable plates \& cups when throwing parties.
$\square$ If cooking a Christmas dinner in your flat, make sure you have a plan for leftovers freeze them, give them to friends \& avoid overbuying in the first place.
$\square$ If you are getting rid of unwanted coats or blankets, see if local shelters want them as they are very important at this time of year!
$\square$ Donate other unwanted items to charity shops instead of throwing them out.

## CHRISTMAS CARDS

Choose cards made from recycled paper that can be recycled again.$\square$ Consider cards supporting charitable causes.
$\square$ Consider sending e-cards, especially for family \& friends who live abroad.
