My experience at <> is primarily with LLM courses, but the aims and ILOs of the Leeds courses appear similar.

The assessment methods seem appropriate and the students seem generally able to work to the required standard.

  - The academic standards demonstrated by the students and, where possible, their performance in relation to students on comparable courses;
  - The strengths and weaknesses of the students as a cohort.

The students' performance reflects a normal distribution pattern. However, some foreign students do not have the necessary language and analytical skills to write dissertations of an adequate quality, primarily at LLM level. Some further assistance may also be required with regard to appropriate academic referencing techniques.
