English Language Test (Compulsory to attend for students enrolled on ELU modules)

If you have enrolled on any ELU modules at the Language Centre then the English Language Test will be used to determine your eligibility for these modules. If you haven't signed up for the English modules but decide that you would like to do the test, then email <code>langc@leeds.ac.uk</code> with your name, student ID number, and which English modules you would like to take as early as possible.
