**Mumps – are you vaccinated?** <u>Find out what you need to do</u>. Mumps is a contagious viral infection that is recognisable by the painful swellings at the side of the face under the ears (parotid glands). Other symptoms of mumps include headaches, joint pain and a high temperature, which may develop a few days before the swelling of the parotid glands. Mumps should not be treated lightly. It can be a severe disease, with potential for serious side-effects.

# **RESEARCH SKILLS AND CAREERS**

**Research Ethics workshop**. This introduction to the University of Leeds ethical review process will take place on 15 May, 2-4pm. It will explore the requirements of ethical review, clarify the application process, discuss the reasons for ethics approval and explore the types of ethical considerations that are relevant to conducting research.
