### DOCTORAL COLLEGE NEWS

**Industrial Action.** You should recently have received an email explaining that some colleagues at the University are planning to participate in nationwide industrial action as part of a national dispute about pensions and pay. We do not expect PGRs to be significantly affected by the industrial action, but we are monitoring the situation carefully and will keep you updated if there are any changes that you need to be aware of. If you have any queries, please contact your <u>Faculty Graduate School</u> in the first instance, particularly if you are expecting to have your Viva or Transfer examination during the strike period. If you are a PGR who teaches, you will receive a separate email from your Head of School or equivalent with more information for you.

General Election. There's going to be a General Election on Thursday 12 December, which means it's incredibly important to make sure you're registered to vote. It's really easy, takes 5 minutes and can all be done online <a href="here">here</a>. Don't forget that you can register here in Leeds <a href="here">and</a> at home; then wherever you end up on 12 December you'll be able to vote. There's lots more information on the <a href="here">Electoral Commission website</a> about who is and isn't eligible to vote in a General Election.

Re-registration can be completed by logging in to Minerva. Please contact your Graduate School if you encounter any issues.



Working off campus? With the increased likelihood of bad weather causing problems getting to campus in autumn and winter, University IT users are more likely to access Citrix (Desktop Anywhere) from home. However there are a limited number of licences available and users can often do what they need by using Office 365. Office 365 gives you access to your email and all your files stored in OneDrive, as well as the familiar Microsoft apps such as Word, PowerPoint and Excel. Storing your files on OneDrive rather than your M:drive will make sure you can access them securely wherever you are.

Minerva. Minerva downtime is planned to begin on Friday 13 December until Tuesday 17 December for an essential upgrade. British Library Doctoral Open Days. The <u>Doctoral Open Days</u> are designed for first year PhD students who are new to the British Library, offering the opportunity to hear from expert and friendly staff and students and network with peers, in all disciplines and from across the UK. Each day will present generic tools and helpful hints, with reference to a different thematic area or time period of the Library's collection, providing a starting point for the PGR's own research at the Library. Places cost £10 (including refreshments) and advance booking is essential, using the above links. All events take place in the British Library Knowledge Centre at St Pancras, London, except for the event on 29 January 2020, which takes place at the Library's site in Boston Spa, Yorkshire.

Merck Innovation Cup. The Innovation Cup is an initiative for PGRs and young professionals in natural sciences, computer sciences, and business administration to attend a training program near Frankfurt, Germany. It is designed to support the professional development of PGRs interested in the pharmaceutical and chemical industry. Participants learn how R&D in the industry works with lectures from Merck managers and scientists. Attendees will also advance an idea to a full project plan with their teams. The participating teams have the chance to win the Innovation Cup award endowed with EUR 20,000 for the most convincing project plan, plus EUR 5,000 for the runner-up. The Innovation Cup is being held 20 – 26 June 2020 near Frankfurt, Germany. Application deadline is **Friday 31 January 2020**. Your travel, accommodation and food expenses are paid for by Merck.

Seventh Young Scholar's Forum in Chinese Studies. Co-organized by The Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK)-Chiang Ching-kuo Foundation Asia-Pacific Centre for Chinese Studies and the Institute of Chinese Studies at CUHK, the Seventh Young Scholar's Forum in Chinese Studies themed 'Intellectual Networks and Knowledge Production: Remapping Chinese Studies' will be held on campus during 28-30 May 2020. The Forum aims to nurture young scholars in Chinese Studies and strengthen their network in the field. PGRs (after completing qualifying examination) and PGR graduates (with less than 5 years of work experience) are invited to present their recent research at the Forum.

Lecture. Chinese and Indian Investment into the UK: Tracking Leading Firms and Future Trends. Chandru Iyer and Ian Zhu from Grant Thornton UK will share the methodology and findings of their annual Tracker surveys which reveal the current and future trends of Chinese and Indian MNEs' investments into the UK. - Access to museum events where students can connect in person

**PGR Internship.** Fixed Term (for 3 months). The Alumni & Development Team are looking to work with a skilled individual on a short-term project, to help them use business intelligence & software functionality to capture, draw out and use more efficiently, information on who our alumni are, what they do and how they can support the University. Individual Writing Consultations. Now available to book through the training catalogue. 30-45 minute individual consultations are available, to discuss with a tutor ways for you to develop your doctoral writing. This is not a proofreading/correction service: the focus is on helping you to help yourself resolve a specific writing issue, which you will need to outline when you make the booking. PGRs will not normally be able to make more than 2 bookings per semester. Appointments are currently available from 13:00-15:00 on Tuesdays and 10:00-12:00 on Thursdays -a

Toshiba Fellowship Programme (TFP). The TFP offers PGRs an opportunity to apply to join Toshiba's research and development laboratories in Japan, initially for one year, on a Research Fellowship Contract. Successful candidates will be assigned to one of the research facilities all located within one and a half hours of central Tokyo. Whichever laboratory you might join, you can expect to be working on highly innovative research in a supportive environment. You will be assigned a mentor from your research group to assist you both at work and outside the workplace, helping you to feel at home in a new country. Applications to the Toshiba Fellowship Programme are now open and you can find out more and apply here. Deadline for applications is **Friday 6 December.**
